



A Youth Coach’s role in a youth’s life may be time-limited and may eventually come to an end. If a youth ends their involvement with the NET mentoring program, the Youth Coach may continue to have contact with the youth if the former NET youth is over the age of 18 and is no longer involved in the child welfare system, **and** if the child initiates contact with his/her former Youth Coach. It is up to the individual volunteer whether or not he/she maintains contact.

If the NET Program Director terminates a volunteer, it is the expectation of the NET Program that the volunteer will cease to have any contact with the youth and his/her family. The volunteer is expected to make it clear to all persons involved (especially the youth) that he/she is no longer functioning in the role of a Youth Coach and will no longer be involved in this youth’s life. It is against NET Program policy for a terminated volunteer to maintain contact with his/her assigned NET youth.

When a volunteer resigns, goes on leave or is terminated for any reason, he/she is expected to turn in all case-related forms, notes and paperwork that he/she may have collected, enabling appropriate disposal of confidential information. Materials should be turned into the Net Program Director at the last supervision meeting.
